




# **Foreword**





# **Pediatric Cancer Program**

Cancer affects people of all ages, even young ones. On the other hand, pediatric cancer is uncommon and treatable with timely detection and appropriate treatment.

Cancer is a leading cause of death for children and adolescents. In high-income nations, more than 80% of children with cancer are treated, whereas in many LMICs, less than 30% of children with cancer are cured. An estimated 400,000 children and adolescents between the ages of 0 and 19 are diagnosed with cancer every year. Leukemias, brain tumors, lymphomas, and solid tumors including neuroblastoma and Wilms tumors are the most prevalent types of cancer in children. Since it is generally not possible to prevent childhood cancer, the best way to lessen its impact and improve outcomes is to prioritize an early, accurate diagnosis, followed by efficient, evidence-based treatment and individualized supportive care.

Worldwide, more than 3 lakh youngsters receive a cancer diagnosis each year. Every year, there are around 50,000 new cases of pediatric cancer in India.

Over the past two decades, India has significantly improved its services for children with cancer. However, as compared to international norms, the outcome is still modest because there are major obstacles to recognition, diagnosis, and treatment.

Major challenges encountered in addressing childhood cancer care:

- Lack of awareness among parents and caregivers on childhood cancer in India.
- Lack of expertise in grassroot healthcare workers in recognising the symptoms of childhood cancer.
- Lack of specialized diagnostic facilities in peripheral centers with lack of knowledge of interpretation.
- Treatment denial (non-acceptance or refusal to undergo treatment) and treatment abandonment (failure to complete treatment when the disease can be effectively controlled), for which financial constraints were the most commonly cited reason.





## **Cancer Treatment Fund**

The YouWeCan Cancer Treatment Fund for Pediatric Patients offers financial support for the treatment of qualified cancer patients, upto Rs. 2,00,000.00 (two lakhs) per patient. Only patients from unprivileged backgrounds who are younger than 18 are qualified to receive assistance from the fund. According to the hospital's treatment plan, all medical expenses for the shortlisted patients are covered, including (but not limited to) diagnostic testing, investigations, chemotherapy, radiation therapy, surgery, and prescription drug costs.

The partner hospital offers all medical services directly associated with the treatment. YouWeCan Foundation's role is limited to providing financial aid to support the cost of treatment.

Strict processes are in place for due diligence and screening of cases. To ensure transparency and to maintain strong financial control, funds are disbursed directly to hospitals and not to beneficiaries or their caregivers/ family.

To fund the entire cost of treatment of the patient, as per the treatment plan of the hospital, capped at a maximum amount of Rs. 2,00,000 per patient.

BRIDGE FUND FOR CANCER TREATMENT

To provide interim and urgent relief to fund the early stage treatment within the first 3 months of diagnosis for those patients that have applied for government funding and awaiting the approval from central &/ or state government health schemes, capped at a maximum of Rs, 50,000 per patient.

# Scholarship for Cancer Survivors

Education plays a significant role in predicting future employment, income, and integration into society in general. As a result, education level may be regarded as a crucial indicator of the effectiveness of long-term survivability. Along with the potential effects of treatment on cognition, skipping school due to treatment and falling behind in academics might have a negative impact on survivors' ability to complete their education.

According to some research, 50% of kids with cancer go to school in the first month after treatment begins. This rises to 70% of kids in the fourth month after treatment begins, but absenteeism is higher in kids with brain tumors than it is in kids with other cancers. Irregular school attendance has been reported to last years after the end of treatment, adding to the educational difficulties experienced by survivors.

The YouWeCan Scholarship provides financial assistance to cancer survivor children from unprivileged backgrounds, to help them get reintegrated into the formal education system, once their cancer treatment has been completed. Once a student has been enrolled for the program, they are provided a scholarship of up-to Rs. 25,000.00 per year. Moreover, they are supported on a year-on-year basis, every year till the time they complete their education.

The Scholarship Program was started in 2016 after Yuvraj observed that a large number of young cancer survivors from underprivileged backgrounds, of any age were dropping out of school after completing their treatment. Although

there were many reasons behind this, the primary reason was due to financial constraints. Initially, the scholarship was restricted to school students only, but in 2018 the criteria was changed to include cancer survivors pursuing their higher studies as well.

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- The Scholarship is open for Cancer Survivors only.
- Applicants must be an Indian resident.
- Applicants must be enrolled in regular School or College.
- The annual family income of the applicant should not be exceeding Rs. 2 lakhs.

I work in a jewelry shop and my wife is a housewife. We are a family of 5 members. Once, while Vyashali was returning from school, she complained of having a stomachache. After seeing the doctor, he explained that she only had a common infection, and that with a few medications, she will recover. However, she frequently complained of stomach pain. She underwent several blood tests and a bone marrow examination after consulting with the doctor. We found out that she has Burkitt's Lymphoma after these tests. When we learned the news, we were devastated.

Vyashali is an exceptionally gifted child. She has an intellectual disability. She therefore has a little bit of a learning disability compared to other children, and she also has cancer. This combined responsibility exhausts both Vyashali and us. Our daughter Vyashali is our pride and joy, and we beseech the almighty to put an end to this illness and grant our daughter a long and healthy life.

Under the direction of Dr. Anand, Vyashali is currently receiving treatment at the Sri Shankara Cancer Hospital in Bangalore. Being the only caregiver for the family, managing the cost of the treatment and other requirements was becoming increasingly challenging. The hospital staff then informed us about the Yuvraj Singh Foundation. I'm grateful to them for their support to Vyashali and my family at this difficult period. She receives timely medical attention thanks to funding from the Yuvraj Singh Foundation, although her condition has not improved much. Her treatment will last six months in all.

In 2020, young Aaradhya was diagnosed with B-cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia which is an aggressive cancer and it progresses quickly. Her family did their best to find a solution to her problems by running from one hospital to another. She finally got admitted to PGICH Noida. The treatment cost was expensive. Despite having no savings and unstable sources of income, her father had to close his shop for constantly going back and forth to and from hospital but they never thought of giving up on their child. Her parents borrowed money from friends and family, Aaradhya had developed Tuberculosis during the treatment which made it difficult for

# Breast Cancer Program SWASTH MAHILA SWASTH BHARAT

Indian women face a high burden of health issues, yet they often lack adequate systemic approaches to address these challenges.

In India, a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer every 3 minutes, and every 6 minutes, a woman succumbs to the disease.

India ranks at #1 for contributing to the highest number of new incidence cases of breast cancer as well as female mortality due to the disease, globally. Since 70% of patients are diagnosed with cancer when the disease is far too advanced (stage 3 or 4), the mortality rate is very high. It is estimated that the five-year survival rate decreases by 2.7 times for breast cancer when it is detected at stage IV as against stage I. Similarly, treatment cost for late-stage cancers is 1.5 to 2 times higher than for early-stage cancers.

In India, people with early-stage cancer are 4.4 times more likely to survive for five years compared to those with advanced-stage cancer. Also, individuals above 65 years old have a 16% lower chance of survival compared to those aged 15–39 years.
























Late-stage presentation is precipitated by two major factors – the absence of proper breast cancer screening programs, and the nonparticipation of patients in such programs if they exist. There are a number of reasons behind this – unawareness, lack of access to quality healthcare facilities, and socio-cultural attitudes. For a screening program to be successful,



the coverage and participation have to be high, and the referral system for the diagnosis and treatment has to be effective.

According to a study, in India, women who had breast cancer lost more healthy years of life. Studies about the occurrence of the disease showed that breast cancer is increasing, especially among women aged 25 to 59. This rise is linked to changes in risk factors across generations. Detecting breast cancer early, either when symptoms appear or through regular screening of asymptomatic women, can reduce the risk of death from advanced stages of the disease. Raising awareness about breast cancer in India could be an effective way to find it early.

Survival rates for breast cancer in India have gotten a bit better, but they're still not as good as in richer countries. We need to put in place

effective plans to control cancer across the country. This includes spreading awareness about breast cancer, making affordable screening available, and ensuring that people can easily access and afford different types of treatment, as well as care for survivors and those in palliative care.

treatment services, counseling, and follow-up care. This stage is critical for destigmatizing breast health issues and prioritizing women's health needs, enabling them to lead healthy and dignified lives. By maintaining open channels of feedback, we continuously refine our model to better serve the needs of our beneficiaries.

Leveraging innovative Al-powered theramlytix technology, we are revolutionizing the breast cancer screening process, making it a non-invasive, painless, and radiation-free experience. This advancement is particularly significant in a society where discussing breast health is often taboo. By breaking down these barriers through education and awareness, we encourage women to perform self-breast exams and seek screenings, addressing both the physical and social impediments to health care.

The empowerment of women and their communities is integral to our mission. 
We will conduct breast cancer screening of 1 million women by 2025, ensuring the following objectives are met:

**Women screened for Breast Cancer** 

Triumphs of Early Detection and Empowerment



In collaboration with the SBI Foundation and the Government of Goa, we are undertaking a groundbreaking project aimed at screening 1,10,000 women in the state for breast cancer, the most prevalent form of cancer among Indian women. This initiative, launched on October 26, 2021, at the Goa Medical College, marks a significant milestone in our commitment to women's health.

Spearheaded by Shri Vishwajit P. Rane, Minister of Health, Woman & Child Development, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, and Industries, Trade & Commerce, Government of Goa, alongside key dignitaries including Smt. Shabnam Singh, Chairperson of YouWeCan Foundation, and Smt. Manjula Kalyanasundaram, Former Managing Director of SBI Foundation, Shri Sanjay Prakash, Managing Director of SBI Foundation, the initiative symbolizes unified efforts to combat breast cancer in the region.

Since its inception, the Swasth Mahila Swasth Goa initiative, led by YouWeCan, has been dedicated to screening women across the state to enhance early detection and treatment of breast abnormalities. With over 70,000 screenings conducted to date, our project has made significant strides towards achieving its goal.

Through meticulous screening efforts, our team has identified 1,514 women as suspects, necessitating further investigation into potential breast tissue abnormalities. While this revelation underscores the importance of early detection, it also highlights the necessity of proactive healthcare initiatives in combating breast cancer.

Among the suspects, 31 confirmed cases of breast cancer have been diagnosed, emphasizing the critical need for timely intervention. Despite the challenges encountered, our initiative remains a beacon of hope, with 29 women currently undergoing treatment for breast cancer.

This underscores the resilience and determination of the individuals involved and underscores the power of community support in overcoming adversity. As the Swasth Mahila Swasth Goa initiative continues until March 2024, its impact will endure, emphasizing the significance of early intervention and collaborative efforts in safeguarding the wellbeing of women across the region.









# **Oral Cancer Initiative**

#### **A Comprehensive Approach**

Oral cancer, often referred to as mouth cancer, arises as a malignancy within the oral cavity, including the lips, mouth, or upper throat. Initially, it might manifest as painless white patches that evolve into red patches, ulcers, and progressive thickening of the mucosa. Particularly on the lips, it could present as a persistent, crusting sore that does not heal and gradually enlarges. Other common symptoms include difficulty or discomfort during swallowing, emerging lumps or nodules in the neck, oral swelling, or numbness in the mouth or lips.

Key risk factors contributing to the onset of oral cancer include tobacco and alcohol use, with dual users facing a significantly increased risk. Other risk factors comprise HPV infection, paan

chewing, and prolonged sun exposure, especially on the lower lip. Diagnosis typically involves a biopsy, complemented by advanced imaging techniques like CT scans, MRI, PET scans, and thorough clinical examinations to evaluate the extent of disease spread.

Preventive strategies against oral cancer focus on tobacco cessation, moderate alcohol intake, sun protection for the lips, HPV vaccination, and avoiding paan. Treatment varies based on the tumor's specifics and may include surgery, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, or targeted therapy, considering the tumor size, location, metastatic spread, and the patient's general health.



## **Problem Statement**

Oral cancer presents a formidable public health concern in India, with over 75,000 new cases annually, making it one of the top three cancers in the country. The high mortality rate, with more than half of the patients succumbing to the disease, mainly due to late diagnosis, calls for immediate action. India contributes one-third of the global oral cancer cases, highlighting an urgent need for targeted intervention strategies.

The prevalence of oral cancer, constituting about 30% of all cancers in India, is alarming. The widespread use of tobacco, affecting 35 crore Indians (30% of the population), significantly drives these statistics, leading to 1 million tobacco-related deaths each year. The stark reality that oral cancer claims one life every six hours in India underscores the critical necessity for comprehensive prevention, detection, and treatment strategies.

The Yuvraj Singh Foundation is determined to make a significant impact on India's oral health landscape, with a particular focus on the battle against oral cancer, closely linked to tobacco consumption. Our comprehensive initiative spans awareness campaigns to preventive screening, aiming to:



# Promote Accessible Screening
